The deadline for submitting a presentation or poster proposal for the 2010 Annual Conference is **Monday, April 19, 2010**. ### Please Submit the Following:

**Part 1:** Proposal cover sheet with the title (8 words or less), speaker's name, OTAC ID number (if living or practicing in California), mailing address, e-mail address, phone and fax numbers, and affiliation (the institution in which you work for). Include a 35-word description of your presentation that would be printed in the program, if accepted; indicate whether this is for a presentation or a poster. If this is for a presentation, indicate how much time you are requesting for your presentation (1 to 3 hours); whether it is a basic, intermediate or advanced course; and what presentation methods you would be using (power point, etc.).

**Part 2:** A description of your presentation including: title, time requested, specific learning objectives, outline of the presentation, and brief description of the significance of your topic. Indicate the area(s) of practice this presentation appeals to. Also include a reference list supporting the information that will be given during the presentation. **Do not put your name, affiliation or personal identifiers in this section.**

**Part 3:** A CV or biographical data sheet on each presenter (maximum of four presenters).

Please assure that the e-mail address you include on your cover sheet is one that you check often, and is able to receive incoming e-mail. **Submission deadline: Monday, April 19, 2010.**
